#### Radio Bicester Media C.I.C. Annual report of the directors For year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September 2015

The directors present their report and financial statements of the company for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September 2015.

#### **Objectives and Activity**

The main activity of the company was developing an internet radio platform for local residents so that they have access to the best local news and entertainment, whilst giving young people and some of the most vulnerable in society the opportunity to broaden their media skills

During the period of these accounts we successfully engaged 60 people in internet radio production processes, workshops and event organising, and a further 30 through a print magazine delivered free around the town every quarter with 3 issues

We hosted 10 music events in which local musicians were given the opportunity to gain exposure to hundreds of locals and be rewarded for their work, and organised the line up of a major stage at Bicester town's biggest street event in the town centre

Through running these projects we set up and facilitated a total of 30 volunteering opportunities for young people still in school, and young adults with mental health problems

The radio programmes and magazine we delivered to the town reached a total audience of 20,000, in combined listener, reader and event attendee figures. The people involved in creating these projects worked on article writing, editing, photography, sound engineering, audio production, video production, publishing, marketing and distribution

We work with a number of various other organisations in order to keep up to speed with the community and reciprocate support for other organisations. We work with local youth arts charity OYAP trust to develop workshops for producing radio programmes, as well as Cherwell District Council who assist with the production and financing of the magazine, ensuring it is always community focused and adding value to the local residents who read it

A number of local businesses and events have supported us with advice, mentoring and resources, and they continue to do so to date, and we continue to develop important relationships with other local businesses, artistic organisations and local events
